Dear Parents

Welcome back to all of our children and families for Session 22-23. We would like to extend a very warm welcome to our new P1 pupils who have all settled in so well!



This year we are able to extend our highly successful outdoor learning sessions with our outdoor instructor using Pupil Equity Funding. These sessions were extremely successful last session in helping children develop a range of skills. Our evaluative questionnaires suggested that parents and children highly valued these sessions. A timetable for your child's sessions can be found below.

We have three key school improvement priorities this session. These are: developing maths teaching strategies, improving our use of assessment data to plan next steps and improving wellbeing and our pupil experience.



We look forward to welcoming you all back into school during our open afternoons. These replace previous soft start sessions and are being held at a time of day which causes less disruption during key teaching time.

## PE / Outdoor Education

We now have our school hall available again for PE so children will have a mixture of indoor and outdoor sessions depending on the activity and weather. Thank you so much for supporting our school PE kit – the children are looking so smart on PE days especially as they stay in kit for the full day.

## School Uniform

This is very important as we get back to having a normal school year and the children are involved in more projects and have visitors in school. ## E-Mail Correspondence/ Groupcall

We are keen to communicate via e-mail as much as possible. If you are having a problem with emails, please let us know as we can always provide a paper copy until the problem is resolved. As all text messages to parents now go through a system called Groupcall, please sign up to this if you have not already done so. Information about Groupcall (Appendix 1) is attached to the end of this newsletter. It is really important that you let us know if you change your email address or phone number throughout the term.

## <u>Water Bottles</u>

It is important that pupils drink throughout the day to stay hydrated. Children should bring in their water bottle each day filled at home then take it home to be cleaned out each evening. Bottles should only contain plain water.

## <u>Parking</u>

When visiting the school, or dropping off/ collecting your child, please park in the car park opposite the Tarbet hotel and walk down the footpath. Please don't park in the staff car park or at the car park entrance as this just causes chaos in an already busy car park. For the same reasons, please don't let your child/ children walk through the staff car park to enter/ leave the school as this is a very busy, dangerous place for small children. The bus bay at the front of the school is only for the school bus/ taxis.

## <u>Attendance</u>

It's important you follow this procedure for safeguarding reasons.

The procedure regarding absence from school is as follows:

You should telephone the school on the first morning of absence to let us know (before 9.15am). If we do not hear from you, we will text, phone or visit to enquire as to why your child is absent. If your child is late, they should visit the school office on their arrival to inform staff that they are in school.

Keep us updated on your child's illness if it lasts longer than 3 or 4 days.

Family holidays during term time are categorised as unauthorised absence. In exceptional circumstances, a family holiday may be categorised as authorised if it is judged to be important for the wellbeing and cohesion of the family. When a pupil is off school for an unauthorised absence, work will not be provided in advance by the school. Any work missed can be caught up on, on their return.

## NHS Highland Guidance

Please find below, advice from NHS Highland on some of the more common childhood illnesses and their associated exclusion periods from school:

If your child has been prescribed antibiotics, please check with your GP as the exclusion period can vary.

If your child contracts an illness not listed above, please contact the Health Protection Team on 01436 704886 for advice and information.

Please do not send your child to school during the exclusion period for any of the above illnesses.

## Access To Free Sanitary Products

The Scottish Government has launched a scheme where sanitary products will be freely available for children in school, both to use in school and to take home, if required. These products will be provided in school toilets; children will be advised of this and that they do not need to ask for these products, they will have access to whatever is required as and when they need to.

## School Lunches/ Snacks and Free School Meals

Children should bring a healthy snack with them to school each day for break time. School lunches cost £2.30 per day and milk is now included in this price. The latest menu has been sent out for your convenience. Please remember, Pre-5, P1-P5 pupils receive a free school meal daily.

If you have still to apply for free school meals, please follow this link or you may request a form from the office. Please do this, as if you are entitled, the school receives Pupil Equity Funding for each pupil registered for free school meals, whether they take them or not. We will benefit financially for each pupil registered as receiving free school meals.

## School Diary/SeeSaw

Please ensure that you check your child's school diary and SeeSaw regularly as teachers will use these to communicate with you and share learning, targets and homework.

## Mobile Phones/ Electronic Devices/ Guidance On Photography and Filming Children

The school has a mobile phone policy for pupils. If a mobile phone is brought to school it must be switched off and kept off until the pupil leaves the school at the end of the day. It may be a good idea to remove mobile phones and electronic devices at night time from pupils' bedrooms during the school week to avoid children using them late at night.

#### Flu Immunisations

The school nurses will visit the school on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October to undertake flu vaccinations. Forms have already been issued. No forms will be accepted on the day.

#### October School Holiday

The school closes on Friday 7th October and re-opens to pupils on Monday 24th October at 9am.

#### Pupil Council

One pupil from each class stage will be selected/elected to represent their class. These pupils will then meet regularly with the Head Teacher to see how they can improve the school. This term will also see our House Captains and Vice Captains elected in Primary 7.

#### Parent Council

The Parent Council works in partnership with the school to plan key priorities. If you wish to join our Parent Council to help shape priorities and future developments please contact the school office – our first meeting of the session will be held on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September in school.

#### <u> PTA</u>

Our school has an active PTA group who help to organise school events and fundraisers – if you are able to spare some time we would love to welcome more parents to join. Please contact the school office and we will direct you to some key contacts. Our next meeting is on the 4<sup>th</sup> of October in school.

#### <u>Parents Evenings</u>

Results from our parental survey indicated that parents liked to be offered the option in school or virtual parents meetings. We are therefore offering two separate session to accommodate different needs and work patterns.

## Seasons for Growth

Our Seasons for Growth sessions will be starting soon lead by Mrs Hendry and our Educational Psychologist Mhairi Irvine. These sessions support any child who has suffered bereavement or who has gone through any significant change in their life that it would help them to talk through in a warm group setting. These sessions would suit P5-P7 pupils and we still have a few places remaining. If your child would benefit from this please contact the school office.
