

Customer Services: Education Sumdog Privacy Notice Your Personal Data

What information do we need?

Argyll and Bute Council will act as the 'Data Controller' in regard to the personal data you provide to us. The Data Protection Officer can be contacted at the Council's headquarters is at Kilmory, Lochgilphead PA31 8RT. The email address is: data.protection@argyll-bute.gov.uk

Arrochar Primary has made a decision to use software called Sumdog to provide you with Education services. This means that personal information about you that you have previously provided in order to receive Education will be shared with this company. This information is contained in the General Education Privacy Notice which can be found on the Council website at <https://www.argyll-bute.gov.uk/data-protection#privacy>. The personal data will include your first name and last name, together with your year stage, class and school.

Why do Sumdog need this information?

Your information is being collected to allow use of the software that is needed to support your numeracy and literacy. There are enhanced benefits to the pupil, parents/carers and the school in using this tool.

The legal bases for collecting your information in these circumstances are:

Article 6(1)(e) – Public Task on the basis of the legal obligation placed on the Education Authority to track and monitor pupil progress and to raise attainment in terms of the undernoted legislation:

- Education (Scotland) Act 1980
- Education (Additional Support for Learning) (Scotland) Act 2009
- Scottish Schools (Parental Involvement) Act 2006
- Standards in Scotland's Schools etc. Act 2000
- Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014

What we will do with your information?

The information Sumdog collects from you will be processed in the EEA. This information is covered by an adequacy finding and a Data Processing Agreement which commits to complying with the GDPR.

Your information will be shared with the recipients or categories of recipients as detailed below:

What we will do with your information	
Who we will share with	Reason for Sharing
Sumdog	Sumdog provide valuable tools to support the learning of numeracy and literacy. To do this they require individual pupil accounts which are identified with first name and last name.
VenturEd Solutions	VenturEd provide the System Integrator service that automatically shares data with Sumdog to set up pupil accounts.

You should also be aware that your data may be downloaded from Sumdog by Arrochar Primary and will be stored on school servers located within the United Kingdom. We will take all reasonable steps to ensure that your data is kept securely and more information on how we do this is provided on the Council website (www.argyll-bute.gov.uk) or can be provided in paper format on request to your School Support 01369 704000.

How long will Sumdog keep your information?

Information will be retained while the school continues to provide you with access to Sumdog. Pupil records will be deleted automatically when pupils leave the school or the school stops subscribing to Sumdog.

Data downloaded from Sumdog by the school will be kept as detailed in the General Education Privacy Notice. Your Rights

When you provide information to the Council, you will have the following rights:

- to withdraw consent at any time, where the legal basis specified above is consent
- to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office
- to request access to your personal data
- to data portability, where the Legal basis specified above is i) consent or ii) performance of a contract
- to request rectification or erasure of your personal data, as so far as the legislation permits
