The children will investigate how the needs of a group in their local community are supported.

They will compare and contrast Edinburgh in the past to society in the present day and contribute to a discussion about similarities and differences.

<u>Homework</u>	Homework will be posted on Google classroom, this will be revision/consolidation of work taught in class; either in spelling, numeracy or literacy. They can access their AR reading accounts at home which will allow them to sit a quiz on a finished book, which earns them points. The details of their logins are in the children's diaries.
